# Member's Report

#### Jr-EQF Logging Program

Being relatively new to HF while at the same time a veteran computer user, I was looking for a way to combine the two in an effort to ease the chore of logging contacts. When I became a Tech Plus, Radar, N2GDY, gave me a brand new log book along with a lecture on the importance of logging my HF contacts. The manual method worked for a while, but I knew there had to be a better and more efficient way to record and organize this information. I spoke to several scasoned hams who felt there was no better way than to manually record contacts. I respect and understand this position, yet I was determined to find another way to handle this task. I downloaded a couple of logging programs from the web, however none seemed to work well. I then tried to put together my own logging program with MS Excel, but still I wasn't satisfied.

When the July issue of QST arrived I started to flip through the pages and came across an ad I had seen many times before from EQF software. Suddenly the computer logging bug returned and I checked out their website where I found a shareware version of Jr-EQF, which is billed as a scaled down version of their main logging program, Log-EQF. I downloaded the program and found myself logging contacts within no time. This DOS based program is very easy to navigate and I found it to contain everything I was looking for in a logging program.

As previously mentioned, this is a shareware program so there is a polite reminder each time the program is started to send in a 25.00 registration fee, for which the user will then receive the latest version on disk, notifications regarding updates, and technical support. Being happy with this program, I went back to the website to register my copy, however I saw that while EQF Software did accept credit cards for on-line registration, they did not provide a secure page in order to do this. I sent an e-mail to Tom, N3EQF, the author of this fine software and he responded back within an hour, offering alternatives to the web registration. I decided to print out the order page and fax it to Tom, to which I received an immediate confirmation of receipt by e-mail. A few days later I received a well packaged disk in the mail that contained the latest release of Jr-EQF.

I highly recommend EQF Software for those Hams who would like an alternative to traditional logging. EQF Software can be found at www.it is.net/eqf and Tom's e-mail address is: n3eqf@usaor.net.


